have plenty of on-stage experience, they are so
young, some of the slightly dated references in
the script had to be explained to them!



Our team have had to overcome some challenges in preparing for the production: there are the usual problems of positioning the cast on stage (especially since there are two rooms in such a small space), rehearsing precise movements and ensuring that no one gets hurt throwing themselves around (Mark is becoming an expert at slapstick and falls). However, unusually, there were some challenges that we haven't faced before: finding loud wallpaper for the bedroom was no problem, but sourcing somewhat plain wallpaper required many hours of research (in the pub). We needed bottles of champagne – one per performance – but now have more than enough for a convivial after-show party. And then there was the problem of turning a rectangular double bed and mattress into a round one – time to break out the angle grinder!



In this production, we welcome Eleanor to our group for her first role; sadly Sabrina (our original Sylvie, and director of our last pantomime) had to pull out, so we immediately welcomed Eleanor to her second role – in the same play.


We hope that you enjoy the show and look forward to seeing you again in September for a trio of mysteries.

THE WRITERSAND THE PLAY

Ray Cooney OBE first appeared on stage in 1946, appearing in many of the Whitehall farces throughout the next two decades, but turned his hand to writing during the 1960s, writing over twenty plays in his career. His son Michael, who is a screenwriter, also working with his father on occasion, wrote 'Cash On Delivery' – the play we performed this time last year.



John Chapman (1927-2001) also made his first appearance in 1946 performing in farce. In 1954 he returned to Brian Rix's company with his first play, 'Dry Rot' (something that some members of our group are keen to perform in future). Ray Cooney joined the cast of this production, soon beginning their collaboration in writing for stage and television.

Move Over Mrs Markham was first performed at the Richmond Theatre in 1969, in which Ray Cooney played the leading male role himself; the play later enjoyed a two-year run at the Vaudeville Theatre.

"Move Over Mrs Markham is set in a very elegant top floor London flat, belonging to Philip and Joanna Markham. The flat has been under renovation, and thus has been largely empty. Philip is a straight-laced publisher of children's books, and he shares an office with his partner, Henry Lodge, on the ground floor. Reluctantly, Philip agrees to let Henry borrow his apartment for the evening to "entertain" his latest girlfriend. At the same time, Joanna Markham is persuaded by Linda Lodge to let her borrow the apartment, so she can entertain her lover. What nobody knows is that the interior designer who had been decorating the apartment for the past three months has decided that this was the night he and the au pair girl would try out the new round bed! When all three sets of people converge on the apartment, expecting to find it empty, chaos and confusion ensue.

The play comprises two acts; there will be a short interval at the end of Act One. Refreshments will be available in the Small Hall during the interval.

Rae Calhan as Joanna Markham

Rae is the longest-serving member of the group appearing in this play and is our group's Chair, make-up and social media expert. Most recently, she has been seen as the saloon owner and murderer's accomplice in *Who Shot The Sheriff?* and the evil Fairy Pernicia in *Puss In Boots* – will she behave herself this time?

Harry owen as alistair spenlow

Harry first appeared in *Rapunzel* in 2017 and has been known for appearing as part of various panto comedy double-acts but was last seen as the Queen in *Puss In Boots*. Away of Pantoland, Harry has portrayed characters in *Free And Easy* and *Agatha Crusty*; recently, he has also directed a school production of *Oliver!*





Eleanor Jane Stevens as Sylvie and Mrs Wilkinson

We welcome Eleanor to her first production with us – jumping in at the deep end by taking on two roles. She has seen several productions before and is keen to take part again (three roles could be possible in September!). Eleanor has previously been involved in children's productions and hoped to join some grown-ups this time.

LINDSEY CLAYTON as Linda Lodge

Lindsey has made regular appearances since 2016 and is always ready to step into a role at short notice or lend a hand backstage to keep the show on track. Recent appearances include Prince Charming in *Cinderella*, a tearful fiancée in *Cash On Delivery* and the Deputy Sheriff in *Who Shot The Sheriff?*

Having appeared on stage elsewhere (and often rehearsing more than one play at a time), Mark first joined our group in 2017 in *I'll Get My Man*; he has also appeared in *It's Never Too Late*, and as the dame in *Rapunzel* and as Frankenstein's creature. In his last role, he played a DSS inspector, showing great versatility as he was attacked by a washing machine, got rather drunk and was finally struck by lightning.

RICHARD PERCIVAL as Henry Lodge

Richard has appeared regularly on our stage since 1999 and served as our Chairman for many years. Most recently, he has appeared as Baron Hardup, a wild-west barman and a King with much to say but no chance of avoiding interruption. Other notable roles include Bluebeard, the Tinman, Sherlock Holmes, Noah, various murderers and Tinkerbell.





STEPHEN BRODY as Walter Pangbourne

Although he is one of the group's newer members, Stephen has appeared in every production since joining us for our 2020 pantomime. Whether he is in the panto chorus (where his timing is improving!), playing naughty old Uncle George in *Cash On Delivery*, or has the stagecoach driver obsessed with lavender bath flakes in *Who Shot The Sheriff?*, Stephen has certainly given us some memorable performances.
